The Upper Canada District School Board (Upper Canada DSB) offers international students the opportunity to study at 21 Canadian high schools, each of which have world class educational facilities including advanced technology, science labs, applied arts, performing arts and sporting opportunities.

10 of our high schools are dedicated International Hub schools that offer specialized language support for English language learners. Our schools are welcoming and supportive; most secondary schools have 400–600 students. Classes have an average of 25 students. Our small class sizes and flexible programs provide students with the personal care and support they need to succeed. Many of our international students have gone on to top post-secondary schools such as the University of Toronto, McGill University, the University of British Columbia, Harvard University, Oxford University and many others.

# About Eastern Ontario

With a wide selection of urban and rural communities, climav to study is a hard choice for international students. The Upper Canada DSB is comprised of several cities and towns across 12,000 square kilometers in an area of Canada called Eastern Ontario. 



#### Ontario Secondary School Diploma Program (OSSD Program)

The OSSD Program gives students an opportunity to earn an Ontario high school diploma. Students are able to start their programs in either September or February. Completion time of the OSSD program depends on a student's English level prior to coming to Canada, what courses they need to complete and their post-secondary goals. Most students complete the program between 1-4 years. For more information about graduation requirements, please see page 56.

### Academic Year / Semester Program

The Academic Year / Semester Program allows students the opportunity to study at a Canadian high school for either one semester or a full school year. Students are able to start their programs in either September or February.

### Short-Term Cultural Program

Students are able to study at a Canadian public school for 1-3 months. Students are able to enroll in the short-term program at any time.

## YOUR HOME AWAY FROM HOME

Being away from friends and family is often the hardest part of an international student's experience. Living in a home where you are comfortable is important for student success.

The Upper Canada DSB partners with The Canada Homestay Network to provide a seamless application, monitoring, and support systems for international students.

Homestay families in the Upper Canada DSB are screened prior to hosting. All host families are required to provide reference checks, criminal record checks, and have a full in person interview and home inspection before they are registered into our host family database.

Host families are chosen based on the information provided in the student application. We take great care in matching students with host families that closely match their preferences and interests. Before arriving to Canada, students will get a chance to know their Canadian host family.

All of our homestay families provide the following for students:



Private bedroom 3 good meals & study area a day

Quality internet access

Friendly & caring support

After a student has arrived to Canada they will be introduced to their local Relationship Manager (RM). The RM is their homestay representative while in Canada. Students, parents, and agents are able to communicate any questions or concerns about a student's homestay experience with their local RM. RM's have scheduled visits to all of our schools where students are able to have a private conversation with the RM about any of their concerns with school or homestay.

When students join our homestay program they become a part of their family and a member of the local community. Through our homestay program students have the opportunity to live with a Canadian family that supports the values and visions that an Upper Canada DSB education stands for.

# Education Pathways

**Support and Guidance** for Academic Achievements





#### Course Eligibility

For international students in a full English immersion academic environment, it is especially important that course placement is appropriate to the student's English language proficiency level. To ensure this, the eligibility for International Students at the Upper Canada DSB to enroll in certain courses depends on students' level of English proficiency. Before arriving, students are required to complete an English language proficiency assessment. The result of this test, in addition to application observations, personal interviews with Upper Canada DSB staff (when available), and academic history will determine students' academic pathways during their time in Canada.

#### **ESL Levels**

The courses and pathways available to students are based on the five ESL levels recognized by the Ontario Ministry of Education. Depending on students ESL levels, certain courses will not be available.

#### ESLAO - Beginner

- Understand, read and retell simple stories
- Give and respond to straightforward directions and instructions
- Write assertive, negative and interrogative sentences
- Write a short structured composition following a model

#### ESLBO - High Beginner

- Maintain face-to-face conversations on familiar topics
- > Use short sentences to give opinions
- Skim a paragraph to find main idea and scan text to find specific information
- Write simple and compound sentences in answering written questions
- Write a short composition following a teacher's outline

#### **ESLCO** – Intermediate

- Take part in conversations on a range of topics
- Take notes from a passage using a graphic organizer in preparation for writing
- Identify a writer's or character's point of view
- Use a variety of simple, compound and complex sentences with some accuracy
- Write short expository paragraphs in response to a reading

#### **ESLDO** – High Intermediate

- > Discuss or explain ideas or issues
- Identify and explain literary elements (theme character, plot and setting)
- > Identify facts and opinions
- Write a passage of 3 or more paragraphs to develop a central idea

#### **ESLEO** – Advanced

- > Express, support and elaborate a point of view
- > Analyze literary elements (themes, character, plot, and setting)
- Infer meaning of unfamiliar words from context
- Write a coherent response to literature which analyses, interprets, and evaluates
- > Information and ideas

## Course of Study

International students at the Upper Canada DSB take 3 or 4 courses in each semester for a maximum of 8 classes in a full school year. Each student has a unique timetable of courses they will study. Depending on a student's program, course of study and the ability for course selection will vary:

#### Short-Term Study Program

Course requests considered but not guaranteed.

#### Academic Year Program

Upper Canada DSB will work to create a program that allows students to enroll in all courses they need to successful complete the school year and continue to the next year of study in their home country.

### Graduation Program

Ability to take all necessary courses for graduation and post-secondary goals within the timeline set forth for in their personalized study plan, assuming student progresses normally.

The courses assigned are based on the student's program requirements, stated preferences, as well as requirements for graduation and eligibility for stated post-secondary study intentions.

This information is provided by the student when applying to study at the Upper Canada DSB, through the submission of a completed Student Self Introduction form when entering the International Education Program and through a meeting with a Guidance Counsellor at the school for each subsequent year of study. Course assignments are also based on the student's level of ESL (eligibility details), availability at the school, and fit within a student's timetable.

#### Specialist High Skills Major

Specialist High Skills Majors (SHSM) let students focus on a career path that matches their skills and interests while meeting the requirements of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma. Students can receive a SHSM seal on their diploma by completing a specific group of 8-10 courses directly relating to a student's field of interest. All schools across the Upper Canada DSB offer SHSM in various fields. Please see our school profile pages for a full list of SHSMs available across our schools.

#### The Student Success Model

The Upper Canada DSB takes pride in providing individualized study plans for all international students. The Upper Canada DSB Student Success Model provides a support network for all students across all of our schools. If students are struggling in school they can meet with a teacher to discuss their issues and concerns. Every week, teaching staff at the schools meet to discuss student concerns that have been raised and work to develop a personalized plan to help students work to achieve their goals.

\*A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

How many credits can I transfer to Canada from my home country?

Students that arrive to Canada part way through their high school diploma will be granted equivalency credits for up to 24 credits taken in their home countries that match with the Ontario curriculum.

Depending on whether a student intends to go to University or College after graduating, the courses they will need to take when they arrive to Canada will differ

## **University Pathway**

### What do I need to attended university?

30 credits with 6 credits that need to be earned in Ontario. All 6 credits earned in Canada need to be grade 12 classes at either the U or M level. Included in these 6 courses needs to be ENG4U - grade 12 university level English.

In addition to this, international students that have studied in a native-English

speaking country for less than 3 years will need to include an IELTS score as part of their university applications. It is recommended that students applying to a university program have an IELTS score of at least 6 as well as a GPA of 70%+. Please check with your university of choice to confirm their entrance requirements and minimum grade levels.

## College Pathway

### What do I need to attend college?

30 credits with 6 credits that need to be earned in Ontario. Within the 6 courses required to be taken in Ontario there is only one course that is mandatory for students who intended to move on to college: ENG4C - grade 12 college level English.

In addition to this, international students that have studied in a native-English speaking country for less than 3 years will need to include an IELTS score as part of their college applications. It is recommended that students applying to a college program have an IELTS score of at least 5.5 as well as a GPA of 60%+.

### Did you know?

Many Canadian colleges have transfer programs that allow students to start their program at the college level and transfer to a university program within 2 years to earn their university diploma. College transfer programs are recommended as a pathway for students who would like to attend university but are not yet ready for eligible for university admission after high school.

## Are there any other courses that are mandatory for graduation?

While there are no other courses that are mandatory for a student to obtain a diploma, certain university and college programs will have additional mandatory courses for students to be eligible to enroll. It is recommended that all OSSD program students speak with their guidance counsellor when they arrive in Canada to confirm they are taking the courses necessary to apply for their desired post-secondary programs.
